Known primarily for her photomontage, she is also a performance artist, zine-maker, musician, documentary-photographer, collaborator and muse.

Join us for an introduction by Director, Andrew Nairne to Jim and Helen Ede's time in the artistic atmosphere of 1930s Hampstead. This will be followed by a guided tour of 2 Willow Road, the modernist home designed by Ernö Goldfinger near to the Edes' former home on Elm Row and its significant collection of twentieth-century art including Henry Moore and Max Ernst.
